

The Cash Book, as its name implies, is a record of only cash transactions; the left hand, or Dr. side, being appropriated to cash receipts, and the Cr. side to cash payments; the two sides making one folio. Where the business is of such a nature that the transactions are partly for cash, as exemplified in the last months transactions, the Journal is compiled from the Day Book, and the Cash Book is kept only as a memorandum, to show the daily balance of cash on hand. But in most cases the cash transactions are not entered on the Day Book at all, but journalized daily or monthly from the Cash Book, thus: Journal Entries resulting from the above. Cash to Sundries. Receipts this day....
